Canada Day – July 1st

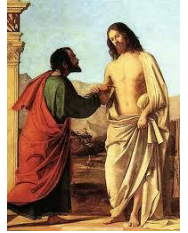

St. Thomas – July 3rd

When it comes to spiritual matters, it might be nice to be able to say we've never experienced doubts, but most of us would be lying. It may be a fleeting thought or it may be a longer, darker night of the soul, but most of us have at least wondered about the mysteries of the universe, including the existence of God. Even when we think we've got it figured out, we may still experience moments when questions loom larger than answers.



St. Thomas had those same feelings. The only difference is that we can sometimes keep our doubt's hidden; St. Thomas's uncertainty has become associated with someone who questions everything – a doubting Thomas.

When Jesus appeared to his apostles after the resurrection, Thomas wasn't present. When he heard the news, Thomas refused to believe it unless he could touch Jesus's wounds himself. Eight days later, much to his shock, Jesus appeared and invited him to do just that.

Thomas was able to have his doubts resolved by a personal visit from Jesus. Most of us won't have that same privilege, but through the eyes of faith, we can pass from disbelief to conviction. After all, when Thomas fell on his knees, saying "My Lord and My God," Jesus answered, "Because you have seen me, Thomas, you have believed. Blessed are they that have not seen and have believed."

Family Life Conference - *Love One another*

First, was St. John Paul II, Charismatic pope of the people, who had special love for youth and family. He never stopped living his first words as our Holy Father, "Be not afraid!" He fearlessly taught and faithfully witnessed to truth. He humbly apologized to the world for the Catholic's Church's past failures and lack of charity.
